## 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Information about awards in this booklet has been abbreviated and standardized as a quick reference. More information is included on application forms, where applicable, and will also be available on the University web site later in 2003. All awards information listed in these tables is subject to change without notice.

### 1.2 APPLICATION FORMS & DEADLINES

The availability of application forms and deadlines is indicated in the right-hand column of the tables later in this booklet. The General Application for Entrance Awards and General Application for Undergraduate Awards are available from the Student Awards & Financial Aid Office and at [www.uregina.ca/awards](http://www.uregina.ca/awards); the former can also be obtained at most Saskatchewan high schools.

Deadlines are effective at 4:30 p.m. If a deadline falls on a weekend or statutory holiday, the deadline becomes 4:30 p.m. on the next business day.

## 1.3 TYPES OF AWARDS

The term "award" encompasses three major types:

1. A **scholarship** is financial aid towards academic studies, awarded on academic merit alone, or on academic merit combined with other criteria.
2. A **bursary** is a grant of money towards fees or expenses. A minimum academic standing is required.
3. A **prize** is a reward for academic merit. Continued study is not a condition.

Scholarships and bursaries may be for students who will be attending the University of Regina for the first time (**entrance** scholarships & bursaries) or for students who have already completed at least one semester at the University of Regina (**undergraduate** scholarships & bursaries). Prizes include awards for achievement in particular courses and programs, and awards for graduating students. Some awards are designated for students who compete in inter-university sports (**athletic** awards).

## 2. COMMONLY-USED TERMS

### Academic Achievement

Unless otherwise stated, academic achievement means an average of 75% or higher. An explanation of how averages are calculated can be found in the next section.

### Direct Entrance

When an entrance award requires "Direct entrance from high school," applicants must be applying for admission to the next semester after high school graduation; usually this means they are graduating in June and applying to the next Fall semester which begins in September. Applicants are also considered to be coming directly from high school if they apply for admission to the Fall semester after graduating in the immediately preceding December or January.

### Disability

Unless otherwise stated, the definition of the World Health Organization of the United Nations applies: that is, "a functional limitation or restriction of an individual's ability to perform an activity."

### Financial Need

When financial need is a criterion for an award, applicants must supply a statement of their projected costs and income. If they live with one or both of their parents, they are considered to be their parents' dependents and must supply a statement of their parents' projected costs and income as well as their own. Applicants who are married or living in a common-law relationship must supply a statement of their spouse's costs and income as well as their own. More information is given on application forms.

### Registration

Unless otherwise stated, a requirement to be "registered in..." indicates the minimum number of credit hours in the recipient of an award must be registered in the semester in which the scholarship is paid. If no statement about registration is made, registration in at least 12 credit hours is required.

### Residence

Unless otherwise stated, a requirement to be "resident in..." means that the candidate must have lived in the stated location for a minimum of twelve consecutive months immediately preceding the date of application for the award.

### Year of Study

The descriptions of undergraduate scholarships and bursaries refer to "year of study." Unless otherwise stated, this should be interpreted as follows:

- Year 1: refers to students who completed 15+ credit hours in their first semester and who are entering second semester
- Year 2: refers to students who have completed 30 credit hours
- Year 3: refers to students who have completed 60 credit hours
- Year 4: refers to students who have completed 90 credit hours

### 3. AVERAGES AND COURSE LOADS

#### 3.1 THE “ADMISSION” OR “ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP” AVERAGE

Unless otherwise stated in the selection criteria for the award, and except as noted for athletic entrance scholarships in §3.2, the admission average for purposes of entrance scholarships and bursaries is calculated on five 30-level (Grade 12) courses. **20-level (Grade 11) courses will also be considered for current high school students who are applying before graduating from Grade 12.** The distribution of the five courses is as shown below. If more than one course meets a requirement, the one with the highest grade will be used.

1. One course at the 30-level<sup>1</sup> in English Language Arts, Français immersion, or Français francsaskois
2. One of Math 20, Math A30, Math B30, or Math C302
3. One 30-level<sup>1</sup> course from list A below
4. One 30-level<sup>1</sup> course from list B below
5. One 30-level<sup>1</sup> elective from list A or list B

A maximum of 2 math courses can be used.

A maximum of one Fine Arts or Physical Education course can be used (marked \*).

Requirements 3, 4, and 5 must be met by different subjects.

The titles of courses in the following lists are from the Saskatchewan high school curriculum. Equivalent courses will be considered for out-of-province applicants when Saskatchewan residence is not a selection criterion.

#### 3.2 ENTERING AVERAGE FOR CIS ELIGIBILITY

CIS regulations state that student athletes who are offered an athletic entrance scholarship must have a minimum 80% entering average. Unless otherwise stated in the selection criteria for a particular award, the entering average for purposes of eligibility under this regulation is calculated as follows:

1. The admission average for entrance scholarships & bursaries (refer to the previous section) is used for:
  - Students entering directly from high school
  - Students who have completed less than one full year of study in a post-secondary program
  - Students who have taken a post-secondary program not recognized by the University of Regina, regardless of length.
2. The average of the last 30 credit hours attempted (equivalent to one full year of study) is used for students who have attended, for at least one full academic year, a post-secondary program recognized by the University of Regina. Non-percentage grades will be converted to percentages using institutional tables maintained by the University of Regina.

#### 3.3 COURSE LOAD & GPAS FOR UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES, AND FOR PRIZES

To be eligible to earn undergraduate scholarships, students must be registered in a full load of courses (15 credit hours) at the University of Regina, unless otherwise stated in the selection criteria. For semester-based scholarships, at least 9 of the minimum 15 credit hours must be numerically-graded.

Eligibility for most undergraduate awards is determined by use of a grade point average (GPA), calculated by (1) multiplying, for each course, the credit hours by the grade earned, (2) adding together the products of that multiplication, (3) adding together the credit hours for the courses used, and (4) dividing the first sum by the second. The calculation is not rounded but is truncated to two decimal places, unless candidates are being ranked, in which case an untruncated average is used.

The GPA used for most average calculations for awards based in whole or in part on academic performance at the university is the TGPA (semester) or CGPA (cumulative), as appropriate. A few awards are based on PGPA (program). University of Regina GPAs are defined as follows:

1. Cumulative grade point average (CGPA): The CGPA is based on all University of Regina courses taken, whether passed or failed, repeated or not.
2. Undergraduate grade point average (UGPA): The UGPA is also based on all University of Regina courses taken, but when a course has been repeated, only the grade in the most recent approved attempt is used (refer to the rules on repeating courses in §5.12 of the University of Regina Undergraduate Calendar).
3. Program grade point average (PGPA): The PGPA is calculated according to UGPA rules, but is based only on the courses that are used in a particular program. A failing grade in a required course is included in the calculation until the course has been successfully repeated (refer to the rules on repeating courses in §5.12 of the University of Regina Undergraduate Calendar).
4. Term GPA (TGPA): The TGPA is calculated according to CGPA rules, and is based on all courses taken in a particular semester (Fall, Winter, or Spring/Summer).

Scholarships based on cumulative academic performance require a minimum CGPA of 75% unless otherwise stated in the selection criteria.

### 4. GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. The University reserves the following rights:
  - to give consideration to fair distribution in the allocation of awards
  - to withhold an award in any year in which there is no candidate who meets the selection criteria
  - to suspend or cancel an award if the recipient commits misconduct (refer to the University of Regina Undergraduate Calendar, §5.14) or if the recipient's conduct on or off campus is deemed to be unprofessional and not in accord with the principles promoted by the University.
2. Unless otherwise stated, candidates for awards must complete application forms to be eligible for consideration, and when an application form lists multiple awards, they will be considered for only those they have marked.

3. Unless otherwise stated, scholarships and bursaries are awarded annually in the Fall semester. They must be accepted for the semester(s) for which they are offered. Deferrals of scholarships will be allowed in the following circumstances only:
    - Students on a Co-op work term: the award will be deferred to the semester following completion of the work term;
    - Students attending Université Laval as part of the Baccalauréat en Education program: the award will be deferred to the Fall semester of their scheduled return.
  4. Students who have been granted any full-semester deferrals of term work or final examinations are not eligible to be awarded a scholarship.
  5. Receipt of awards is conditional upon the recipient's compliance with all of the terms, conditions, guidelines and regulations as set out in the terms of reference. In addition, scholarship recipients must be registered in at least 12 credit hours throughout the semester in which the scholarship is paid, unless otherwise stated in the selection criteria for that scholarship. Bursary recipients must be registered in the semester in which the award is paid, but there is no minimum number of credit hours.
- Recipients who do not meet these requirements will have their award withdrawn and will be required to repay it.
6. Awards are credited to the recipient's student account after the semester begins. The first charges against them are tuition and fees, followed by any other outstanding debits on the account. Once the student account is clear, any remainder is issued to the student, as a cheque, near the end of the first month of classes. In some cases, scholarships are paid in two instalments, of which the second may be conditional on academic performance; such conditions are noted in the descriptions of awards.
  7. Unless otherwise noted, students must be attending the University of Regina, or participating in a formal exchange program in which they pay tuition and fees at the University of Regina, in order to receive a scholarship or bursary.
  8. Appeals of awards regulations are considered first by the Assistant Registrar (Financial Aid). These decisions may be further appealed to the Undergraduate Scholarship Committee, which meets in late September and early May. Appeals must be submitted in writing to the Student Awards & Financial Aid Office, and must be accompanied by a certificate from an attending physician if the appeal is on medical grounds.

## 5. ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES

### 5.1 UNIVERSITY OF REGINA CENTENNIAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The two awards listed below are available to all applicants for admission to the University of Regina who meet the selection criteria. Recipients must register for at least 12 credit hours in the semester for which they are admitted.
