Academic Achievement: Unless otherwise stated, academic achievement means an average of 75% or higher.

Direct Entrance: When an entrance award requires “Direct entrance from high school,” applicants must be applying for admission to the next semester after high school graduation; usually this means they are graduating in June and applying to the upcoming Fall semester which begins in September. Applicants are also considered to be coming directly from high school if they apply for admission to the Fall semester after graduating in the preceding December or January.

Disability: Students who are unable, because of a disability, to register in the minimum credit hours stated in a scholarship’s terms of reference, may nevertheless be eligible for consideration if their maximum course load is specified and documented by a professional qualified to assess their disability. Students must have been registered with, and their documentation must have been provided to and verified by, the University of Regina’s Disability Resource Office at the start of each semester during which the student may be considered for a scholarship or bursary.

Statement of Finances: When financial need is a criterion for an award, applicants must supply a statement of their projected costs and income. If they live with one or both of their parents, they are considered to be their parents’ dependent and must supply a statement of their parents’ projected costs and income as well as their own. Registration: Unless otherwise stated, a requirement to be “registered in…” indicates the minimum number of credit hours the recipient of an award must be registered in throughout the semester in which the scholarship is paid. 5. One further elective from list A or B

Notes:

- a. A second 30 level course in English Language Arts, Français immersion, or Français fransaskois may be used but only as a 5th subject
- b. A maximum of 2 math courses may be used including Math 20 and Calculus 30
- c. A maximum of one Fine Arts, Christian Ethics or Physical Education course (marked *) can be used
- d. Requirements 3, 4, and 5 must be met by different subjects

- Thomas Babcock Entrance Bursary - \$1,000**
Must be admitted to a degree or pre degree program through any faculty at the University of Regina and registered in full-time studies (12 credit hours). Complete Section 5 as the recipient will be selected on the basis of demonstrated financial need
- Allan Blakeney Entrance Scholarship - \$3,300**
Must be a full-time student beginning the first year in a direct entry program at the University of Regina with no restriction as to college or course of study. Applicants must be Saskatchewan residents. Selection based on academic achievement in high school and demonstrated interest, contributions and aptitude for activities related to society's institutions or government and public service. - Canadian Council of Muslim Women-Regina Entrance Scholarship - \$800**
The scholarship will be presented annually to a University of Regina entering student who has a minimum entrance scholarship average of 80%. The recipient must be registered in 12 or more credit hours of study in the semester the scholarship is paid out. Preference to an entering female Muslim student or male Muslim student. If no application is received from a Muslim student, the award is open to any student who has met the other eligibility criteria. You must demonstrate through writing highlights of your volunteerism within the Muslim community and your familiarity with the Muslim faith (not to exceed 250 words). - Holt-Todoruck Entrance Bursary – 2 @ \$2,200**
These bursaries are presented annually to University of Regina students who are entering directly from a Regina high school with an 80% or higher entrance scholarship average. One award to a female student and one to a male student. Recipient must be registered in at least 12 credit hours in the semester in which the bursary is paid. - Murray Hutchings Entrance Scholarship - 2 @ \$1,650**
Awarded to students who have applied directly from a Canadian high school and are registering for full-time studies (minimum 12 credit hours) in a program leading to a Bachelor of Business Administration degree (qualifying year or Yr 1 Business Administration Excellence program). Applicants must have an entrance scholarship average of at least 85%
- William Borden Ingram Award – up to 5 @ \$2,250**
Awarded to a student who has been admitted directly from high school to a four-year program in the Faculty of Arts. The successful applicant must have a minimum 85% average on those courses used for entry into the Faculty of Arts and must be registered in at least 12 credit hours per semester. Given that this is to be awarded to an entering student, provisional high school marks will be used to determine eligibility. The award will be made each year to the student who meets the above criteria and who best demonstrates financial need, complete Section 5. The award may be renewed for 3 additional years provided that you remain in a 4 year program in the Faculty of Arts and maintain a 75% average in the preceding academic year on a minimum of 24 credit hours
- Investment Advisors of BMO Nesbitt Burns Entrance Bursary - \$1,250**
Awarded to a student who has applied directly from high school and is registering for full-time studies (12 credit hours) in a program leading to a Bachelor of Business Administration degree (qualifying year or Yr 1 Business Administration Excellence program). The award will be made each year to the student who meets the above criteria and who best demonstrates financial need, complete Section 5. Applicants must have a minimum admission average of 75%

- J.W. & Joan McLellan & Family Entrance Award - \$1,000**
All graduates of Saskatchewan high schools who enrol in first year at the University of Regina for the first time are eligible. A minimum percentage average of 80% based on courses used for admission is required. For those who meet this requirement, the applicant who best demonstrates financial need will be selected. Must register and remain registered in 12 credit hours in the Fall semester
Complete Section 5
- Regina Medical Laboratories Ltd. Entrance Scholarship – 2 @ \$1,700**
Awarded to students who have applied directly from a Canadian high school, and who have enrolled for full-time studies (15 credit hours) in the course requirements of a pre-professional program at the University of Regina, which will lead to a career in Health Sciences. A minimum percentage of 75% based upon courses used for admission is required. Must register and remain registered in 12 credit hours in the Fall semester The scholarship may be renewed for one additional year. To be eligible for renewal, students must enrol in at least 15 credit hours at the University of Regina and have maintained an average of 75% in the first year of study. When the scholarship is renewed for a second year, no new scholarship will be available to other applicants in that year
- Anne Rigney Entrance Scholarship - \$3,000**
Awarded to the most outstanding Canadian student entering the Faculty of Arts at the University of Regina directly from high school to study in the areas of Humanities or Social Sciences. Selection is based on academic achievement and a letter of reference from the applicant's high school principal outlining the applicant's scholastic achievement and potential. Provisional high school marks will be used in the selection process. The award is paid in 2 instalments of \$1,500 each. In order to qualify for payment of the second instalment the recipient must achieve a Term Grade Point Average of 75% in the preceding semester
- Rural Student Entrance Scholarship – 20 @ \$2,000**
Must be entering directly from a rural Saskatchewan high school (not residing in the cities of Estevan, Humboldt, Lloydminster, Melfort, Melville, Moose Jaw, North Battleford, Prince Albert, Regina, Saskatoon, Swift Current, Weyburn, or Yorkton). Must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or designated as a protected person . Must have an Entrance Scholarship Average of 85% or higher. Must register & remain registered in a minimum of 12 credit hours throughout the term in which the scholarship is paid out. This scholarship is paid in 2 installments of \$1,000 each. To receive the second payment you must have a Term Grade Point Average (TGPA) of 75% and be registered and remain registered in a minimum of 12 credit hours in the Winter semester. Must demonstrate how your rural upbringing benefited you, and details of activities you have been involved with in the past five years which positively impacted your community. Complete Section 4h & 4i
- Saskatchewan Science Fair Scholarship - \$950**
Awarded to a student entering the Faculty of Engineering or Science at the University of Regina directly from high school who has participated in a Saskatchewan Regional Science Fair. Candidates will be selected on the basis of academic achievement in high school. The student must register and remain registered in at least 15 credit hours in the Fall semester. Candidates will be required to submit a one-page summary discussing their involvement in a Saskatchewan Regional Science Fair. Complete Section 4f
- SaskEnergy Scholarship – 5 @ \$2,500**
Awarded to entering students who have lived in Saskatchewan for 12 consecutive months preceding the date of application. Must be pursuing an undergraduate degree in one of the following: Arts (Economics, English, Journalism, Political Science, Resource and Environmental Studies), Business Administration, Engineering, or Science (Computer Science, Geology). Must have a minimum Entrance Scholarship Average of 80% in the most recent year of study. Must demonstrate academic ability, leadership skills, financial need, and community involvement. You may not hold a SaskEnergy award in conjunction with other scholarships or bursaries exceeding an aggregate total of \$5,000. Complete sections 4m & 5
- SaskPower Scholarship – 2 @ \$3,000**
Awarded to a student entering the University of Regina in the areas of Business Administration and Electronic Systems Engineering with a minimum entrance scholarship average of 70%. Applicant must be a resident of Saskatchewan, and must show demonstrated extra curricular activities, community involvement or leadership. Complete section 4b & 4c, showing your demonstrated extra curricular activities and your community involvement or leadership skills. One scholarship for a major in Electronic Systems Engineering and one scholarship for a major in Business Administration
- Elmer Shaw Entrance Bursaries – 2 @ \$1,300**
Awarded on the basis of financial need to Saskatchewan students accepted for admission to 1st year studies at the University of Regina immediately following completion of high school. Students must have a minimum entrance scholarship average of 70%. Must register and remain registered in 12 credit hours in the Fall semester. Complete Section 5
- Elmer Shaw Entrance Scholarship – \$4,500**
Awarded to a student graduating from a Saskatchewan high school and immediately entering the University of Regina. Eligibility is restricted to those students with a minimum entrance scholarship average of 90% or higher. Payment is made over 2 semesters, provided that you register and remain registered in 12 credit hours in the Fall semester and Winter semester. In order to receive the second instalment you must maintain an average of at least 75% in the first semester

- Elmer Shaw Special Talent Entrance Scholarship - \$1,500**
Awarded to a Saskatchewan student who has demonstrated outstanding talent and/or leadership in any field. Applicants must have been admitted to first-year studies at the University of Regina in the Fall semester immediately after completion of high school. Applicants must have a minimum Entrance Scholarship Average of 70% on grade 12 subjects used for admission. Must register and remain registered in 12 credit hours in the Fall semester. Enclose 2 reference letters & a résumé. Selection is based on talent and/or leadership skills. Complete Section 4e
- S. E. Stewart Faculty of Arts Entrance Scholarship - \$1,850**
Awarded to an outstanding student entering the Faculty of Arts at the University of Regina who intends to complete a degree in the Faculty of Arts (to include Humanities, Social Sciences, or Pre-Journalism). Selection is based on academic achievement and a letter of reference from the applicant's high school principal or other appropriate person outlining the applicant's academic achievement and potential. Student must be registered and remain registered in a minimum of 12 credit hours
- Sun Life Financial Entrance Scholarship - \$2,000**
Awarded in the Fall semester to an outstanding student who has applied directly from high school and is registering for full-time studies (15 credit hours). Students may hold this award in conjunction with any other university scholarship. Selection based on academic achievement
- Imre Szabados Scholarship in the Fine Arts – \$1,000**
Awarded to a graduate of a Regina high school with a minimum admission average of 80%. Preference will be given to a Sheldon-Williams Collegiate graduate. The student must be registered at the University of Regina and intends to pursue a degree in the Faculty of Fine Arts in Music or the Visual Arts. The scholarship will be fairly distributed between male and female students and awarded every other year. The period of tenure is 2 years unless the student fails to maintain a Cumulative Grade Point Average of 75%. Upon completion of one student's tenure the scholarship will be awarded to another student. When the scholarship is renewed for a second year, no new scholarship will be available to other applicants in that year
- University of Regina Aboriginal Student Engineering, Math, and Science Entrance Bursary – 3 @ \$1,250**
You must be entering the Faculty of Engineering, the Faculty of Science with a declared Math major or the Faculty of Science.
