Black History Month

Black History Month draws our attention to the history of Black communities in Canada and their fight against systemic and structural inequities. Viola Desmond (1914-1965) was a Canadian civil, women's rights activist and business woman. She is sometimes called, 'Canada's Rosa Parks'. Her public challenge of racism and demanding civil rights took place nine years prior to Rosa Parks' refusal to give up her seat on the bus.

In 1946, Viola requested a ticket for the main floor of Roseland theatre in Sydney, Nova Scotia. Viola was refused, dragged out of the theatre, arrested and spent the night in a jail cell. While Viola lost her legal battle, her legacy led to the community rising up together to fight for racial equality. In 2010, Viola was granted posthumous free pardon.
