

FINAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

FINALIZE YOUR CONDITIONAL ADMISSION FOR FALL 2022

Step One: Check your admission letter to confirm which faculty of study you have been admitted to and then find your faculty in the chart below. You will need to **complete all of the corresponding high school courses** with the minimum overall average required.

Step Two: Submit your Final Official Transcript from the Ministry of Education or the high school that you attended, after graduation, by August 1, 2022. This transcript must indicate your graduation date.

Final official high school transcripts must be received by Enrolment Services by August 1, 2022.

Faxes, photocopies, and emailed transcripts from the student are NOT accepted.

- Courses identified above should be five credits each. Two three-credit courses* may be used in place of one five-credit course.
