ICBC Results

Congratulations to the Hill ICBC team for their success in Kingston over the weekend! The Hill Marketing team came in first overall and the Hill Debate team came in third overall.

Three teams from the Hill School of Business competed in the final round of the Inter-Collegiate Business Competition (ICBC) at Queen's University, January 15 through 17. The accounting team of Jaimee Dowdeswell and Jingwen Su, coached by Shelley Lukasewich and the marketing team of

Brett Kitchen and Tiffany Lougheed, coached by Tatiana Levit made it to the final round of competition based on their submissions in the preliminary round in late October. These results in the preliminary round put the Hill team in the top six universities overall allowing them to also bring a debate team including Kevin Chow and Robert Vancise, coached by Lisa Watson. This is the third time in four



years that the Hill school has placed in the top six in the preliminary round. In 2015 ICBC received 145 submissions from 31 business schools around the world in the preliminary round. Of this group, 14 schools had teams advance to the second and final round.

JDC West Results

The Hill School of Business competed at the JDC West Competition in Victoria January 16 to 18. JDC West sees teams from 12 Western Canadian universities compete in academics, athletics, debate and social competitions. It also includes a charity and community involvement component.

This year the team defended their "School of the Year" title from last year and maintained a place in the top three. The Hill School took 3rd place as both "School of the Year" and "Academic School of the Year"! Alberta placed 2nd in both categories, and the Asper School placed 1st overall.

In order to secure the Academic and School of the Year placements, all of our teams had to have scored consistently high across all categories.

Directors Education Program

The Levene Graduate School of Business has partnered with the Edwards School of Business to offer the Directors Education Program (DEP). The Directors Education Program was developed by the Institute of Corporate Directors (ICD) and Rotman School of Management and provides an experiential learning environment for directors. The program is offered across Canada in leading business schools and is designed

for executives with broad experience who want to improve their skills and be more effective in the boardroom. This is the first jointly delivered, two-city DEP in Canada.

The ICD-Rotman DEP has been specifically designed to help directors overcome the challenges they encounter in the boardroom by introducing activities and processes that assist them in fulfilling their role. The program addresses

challenges experienced in the boardroom due to information gaps, time squeezes and behavioural dynamics.

The Saskatchewan offering of the DEP will run over 12 days in four three-day modules with two modules being delivered in Saskatoon and two in Regina. The deadline for applications is January 30, 2015.
