For 12 days, 13 students from EMBA Cohort 9 visited Estonia, Latvia, and Germany. Why Estonia and Latvia? These countries rebuilt themselves after the Soviet occupation ended in 1991; they provide a great case study on how they had to build their economies and brand-new systems of government. The EMBA students then met up with the eight MBA students to visit German sites together. The German visit provided a contrast with Germany's world-class industry.

Trip learnings included:

We also had support from the Estonia Business School, Latvia Investment Agency, and the Worms University of Applied Sciences in setting up our tour. Of course, there was time to visit medieval attractions, enjoy great food, and to bond with peers.

Editor's note: A second group of 8 MBA students from the Levene School participated in a study tour from May 16 to 27 visiting Germany, Estonia and Finland.

The EMBA group was led by Bruce Anderson and joined by Levene School Manager Steve Weild, and the MBA group was led by Ron Camp and Dwight Heinrichs.

The study is called *Reputation and cooperative signals: Applications and limita-tions.* Dr. Mishra is an Assistant Professor in the faculty, and has an appointment as the Viterra Faculty Fellow in Business Administration.
