




The Co-operative
Education Program is an
opportunity for you to apply
the principles learned in
the classroom in a real-life
work environment.

When you participate in the Co-op program, you gain paid work experience in an area related to your studies. Not only does this enhance your learning experience, but it also provides valuable networking opportunities for employment after graduation.

During Co-op placements, students are full-time employees, paid competitive salaries, and can be hired after graduation. This is your opportunity to earn while you learn!

Co-op is an optional program consisting of two work terms; either two separate four month terms or one eight month term with an optional third work term. You will receive ongoing support from the University of Regina Advising and Career Centre for resume preparation, job search, and work placement.

Make the most of your learning and gain real-life experience that will enhance your resume, upgrade your interview skills, and improve your job search abilities.



ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for the Co-op option, students must have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours, be a full-time student in good standing with no failing grades, and normally have obtained a minimum CGPA of 75% before applying.

CREDIT

Co-op is a non-credit program. After successful completion of each work term, including the evaluation and work term report, you will attain a passing grade for the work term.

FEES

Should you receive a placement, Co-op fees are assessed in the semester that you are registered for your work term. In addition, other full-time mandatory student fees and the international surcharge (if applicable) apply.

We recognize that pursuing your dreams can be a costly endeavor. To minimize that financial burden, the Levene School of Business and the University of Regina offer a number of scholarships and awards to offset the cost of your post-secondary education.



LEVENE MBA ADVANTAGE ENTRANCE AWARD

Domestic applicants with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from the Paul J. Hill School of Business or a B. Admin degree from the First Nations University of Canada may be eligible for up to \$2,500 toward their pursuit of a Levene MBA and HBS Online CORe Certificate.

Candidates with an exceptional GMAT score and incoming CGPA may be eligible for a multi-year, automatic entrance scholarship.

INDIGENOUS PATHWAYS AWARD

The Indigenous Pathway Award is a \$20,000 CAD multi-year award available through the Levene Indigenous Pathways Program. The initiative recognizes that all Canadians benefit from quality education and the economic impact of robust and successful Indigenous businesses.

Eligibility

The Indigenous Pathway Award may be available to Indigenous students who have completed high school and are pursuing a post-secondary education or who have completed an undergraduate degree and want to pursue graduate-level education.


