Seussical KIDS Show Synopsis

This musical is great fun for the whole family! Horton the Elephant, the Cat in the Hat and all your favorite Dr. Seuss characters spring to life onstage in *Seussical KIDS*, a fantastical musical extravaganza from Tony-winners, Lynn Ahrens and Stephen Flaherty. Transporting audiences from the Jungle of Nool to the Circus McGurkus, the Cat in the Hat, our narrator, tells the story of Horton. Horton is an elephant who discovers a speck of dust containing tiny people called the Whos, including Jojo, a Who child, who gets in trouble for thinking too many "thinks." Horton's challenge is twofold — not only must he protect the Whos from a world of naysayers and dangers, but he must also guard an abandoned egg that's been left in his care by the irresponsible Mayzie La Bird. Although Horton faces ridicule, danger, kidnapping and a trial, the intrepid Gertrude McFuzz never loses faith in him. The powers of friendship, loyalty, family and community are challenged, but will they emerge triumphant?

There will be a short 15-minute intermission between each show to reset the stage. Each show is approximately 30-40 minutes.
