ADMINISTRATION OF THE OATH OF OFFICE

The Administrator of the Province of Saskatchewan, **Her Honour the Honourable Bernadette McIntyre**, SOM, Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan, will address the Chancellor:

*"Do you **Cadmus Steele Delorme** pledge yourself to perform the duties of the Chancellor of the University of Regina as prescribed by law and by the by-laws of the University; and do you promise to defend the rights and so promote the welfare of the University and the members thereof?"*

*"In the name of the University of Regina, I now install you, **Cadmus Steele Delorme**, in the office of the Chancellor of the University of Regina and I invest you with the responsibility pertaining to that office."*

Cadmus Delorme, a Cree and Saulteaux member of Cowessess First Nation, will be installed as the University of Regina's tenth Chancellor at the University of Regina's fall convocation. His installation marks a new chapter in Delorme's long and meaningful relationship with the University that spans more than 15 years.

Delorme first joined the University community as an undergraduate student at First Nations University of Canada, where he earned a Bachelor of Administration and a Certificate in Hospitality, Tourism and Gaming Entertainment Management. He later completed a Master of Public Administration from the Johnson Shoyama Graduate School of Public Policy. Over the years, he has also contributed to the University as a student leader, ambassador, and most recently as Chair of the Board of Governors.

A nationally recognized voice for reconciliation and Indigenous governance, Delorme served as Chief of Cowessess First Nation from 2016 to 2023. During his tenure, the Nation advanced renewable energy, agriculture, and land stewardship projects and became the first in Canada to sign an agreement with the federal government to assume jurisdiction over children in care.

Delorme continues to build bridges through his work as a founder of OneHoop Advisory Services, which supports community development, economic growth, and reconciliation initiatives. The Regina-based private investment firm targets private mid-size companies for investment by First Nation and Métis communities. His leadership extends to provincial and national roles, including serving on the Saskatchewan Gaming Corporation Board of Directors, chairing the Residential Schools Document Advisory Committee, and participating as a 2023 Banff Forum delegate.

A recipient of the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal and a CBC Saskatchewan Future 40 honouree, Delorme is also a dedicated athlete and former provincial golf champion. Cadmus, his wife Kimberly and their family share their time between Regina and Cowessess First Nation.

Chancellor Delorme's custom regalia features a black gown with green velvet-accented sleeves and gold trim, reflecting both tradition and distinction. As a meaningful personal addition, he has incorporated a beaded stole and moccasins into his official attire—honouring his educational journey, family values, and ongoing commitment to community service.

THE HONOURABLE VAUGHN SOLOMON SCHOFIELD

For a lifetime of service, leadership, and for her contributions to the betterment of her community, province, and country, the Honourable Vaughn Solomon Schofield SOM, SVM, CD will receive the University of Regina's highest honour, an honorary degree, at this fall's convocation ceremony. The recognition carries deep personal meaning for Solomon Schofield. Born and raised in Regina, Solomon Schofield began her post-secondary journey at the University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus before completing studies in fashion merchandising at the Rae-Vogue School in Chicago. Those early experiences set the stage for a career that crossed borders and bridged communities, from Saskatchewan to South America, and from business boardrooms to military bases.

Her path was far from conventional. In the 1980s, she chaired the board of a 200,000-member crime-prevention organization, travelling throughout North and South America to establish Crime Watch groups. Fluent in both English and Spanish, she worked with the government of Guayaquil, Ecuador, and even hosted a crime prevention television talk show in Fort Lauderdale, where she was twice named Florida's Crime Prevention Woman of the Year. Back in Canada, she became president and CEO of the Western Group of Companies. Yet it was her commitment to public service that ultimately defined her legacy.

In 2012, she was appointed Saskatchewan's 21st Lieutenant Governor. During her six-year term, she focused on Canada's military, creating the country's only military service appreciation pin and presenting more than 9,000 of them to members of the Armed Forces around the world. She now serves as Saskatchewan provincial chair of the Canadian Forces Liaison Council and Honorary Colonel of 15 Wing Moose Jaw and was awarded the Canadian Forces Medallion for Distinguished Service, the highest honour the military can bestow on a civilian.

Her contributions extend far beyond the military. She has served on boards and organizations including SaskWater, SaskPower, Regina Airport Authority, St. John Ambulance, RCMP Heritage Centre, and Health Arts Society. Her accolades include the Saskatchewan Order of Merit, Saskatchewan Volunteer Medal, Diamond Jubilee Medal, and most recently, King Charles III Coronation Medal in 2024.

UNIVERSITY OF REGINA PRESIDENT'S DISTINGUISHED GRADUATE STUDENT AWARD

The University of Regina President's Distinguished Graduate Student Award is awarded at Fall Convocation to the most distinguished student at the Master's or Doctoral level who has defended theses, or completed final exhibitions or performances, and is graduating at either the spring or fall convocation ceremony.

Dr. Trudy Lynn Keil, Doctor of Philosophy in Education

Dr. Keil's PhD research explored teacher activism. Her thesis, *Alliances, Assemblages, and Affect: Teacher Activism Within and Beyond the Union in Saskatchewan*, offers new insights into how educators advocate for social justice and equity. During her studies, Dr. Keil published six peer-reviewed journal articles and one book chapter, and presented at numerous national and international conferences, including four times at the prestigious American Educational Research Association (AERA). Dr. Keil's supervisor, Dr. Pamela Osmond-Johnson, describes her as embodying the highest standards of scholarship, leadership, and service, and demonstrating a deep commitment to her community and profession.

Dr. Keil received a SSHRC Doctoral Fellowship, a national award recognizing outstanding research in the social sciences and humanities. UNIVERSITY OF REGINA PRESIDENT'S MEDAL AND FACULTY OF KINESIOLOGY AND HEALTH STUDIES DEAN'S MEDAL

The University of Regina President's Medal is awarded at each Spring and Fall Convocation to a student receiving a first undergraduate degree who has shown academic excellence as well as major leadership and commitment to extra-curricular activities while a student at the University.

Chantel Suzanne Hoag, Bachelor of Health Studies *with Distinction*

Chantel is an exceptional student whose academic excellence, leadership, and community service embody the spirit and purpose of this prestigious award. Chantel has consistently demonstrated a deep commitment to both her studies and her community. She is graduating with an undergraduate grade point average of 82.60%. She was named to the Dean's Honour List in both 2021 and 2022 and was the recipient of several scholarships and awards including the Academic Silver Scholarship, and Inspiring Leadership Fellowship. Her scholastic achievements reflect her discipline, intellectual curiosity, and passion for health and human performance.

Chantel's leadership has left a lasting impact on campus life. She served as Chair of the Varsity Club Athletics Board, where she provided thoughtful leadership and advocated for student-athletes. The Faculty of Business Administration Dean's Medal is awarded at each Spring and Fall Convocation to a student receiving a first degree with a minimum average of 80% who has shown leadership in and commitment to extra-curricular activities while at the University of Regina.

Pawan Parekh, Bachelor of Business Administration in Accounting, *with Great Distinction* – Co-operative Education

In addition to maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 90.05%, Pawan Parekh has demonstrated exceptional commitment and leadership in extracurricular activities.

He has been named to the Dean's Honor List seven times and awarded multiple scholarships, including three Academic Silver Scholarships. In 2023, he was inducted into the Faculty's prestigious Accounting Fellowship Program, which has recognized top accounting students since 1994.

In 2016, Laura and her family returned to her hometown in Saskatchewan, where her work in the local school community further strengthened her commitment to education and inspired her to pursue a career as a teacher.

In 2021, Laura began her Education Degree at the University of Regina, specializing in elementary education. During this time, she and her family celebrated the arrival of their second child. Balancing family responsibilities with her academic pursuits, Laura demonstrated remarkable dedication and excellence. In recognition of her outstanding achievements, she was awarded the Academic Silver Prize and the Grant Mitchell Memorial Bursary.

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION AFTER DEGREE CONVOCATION PRIZE

The Bachelor of Education After Degree Convocation Prize is awarded to the most distinguished graduate at each convocation from the Bachelor of Education After Degree program who achieved a final assessment of 'Outstanding' in their internship and the highest program grade point average (PGPA).

Marten Fischer Sealy, Bachelor of Education After Degree - Elementary Education (YNTEP – Yukon Native Teacher Education Program), *with Great Distinction*

Marten's teaching practicum experiences reflect both his dedication to education and his commitment to northern communities. His placements included a rural experience at Nelnah Bessie John School in Beaver Creek, Yukon, as well as a four-month internship with the Grade 9 Outdoor Education Program at Wood Street Centre in Whitehorse. Alongside his academic studies, Marten engaged in extracurricular research with Dr. Frances Ross-Furlong, where he both learned from and contributed to land-based programming in Old Crow, Yukon.

UNIVERSITY PRIZE IN ARTS

The University Prize in Arts is awarded to the most distinguished graduate in the Faculty of Arts receiving a first degree.

Meagan Zigante-Wall, Bachelor of Science in Nursing *with Great Distinction*

Meagan entered the SCBScN program in 2022, and quickly distinguished herself academically. She was named to the Dean's Honour List in Fall 2024 and received the Academic Silver Prize in 2025. Meagan balanced her studies with meaningful extracurricular involvement, serving as a peer mentor and volunteering with Souls Harbour Rescue Mission and the KidSport Race. Her previous work experience allowed her to provide trauma-informed care in clinical settings. COLLEGE OF REGISTERED NURSES OF SASKATCHEWAN GOLD MEDAL FOR EXCELLENCE IN CLINICAL PRACTICE

The College of Registered Nurses of Saskatchewan Gold Medal for Excellence in Clinical Practice is awarded to the graduate of the Saskatchewan Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing (SCBScN) program who demonstrates excellence in clinical practice through the attainment of the highest combined average in four required 300-level clinical courses.

Kristen is from Liidlii Kue, Northwest Territories. She is proud member of the Liidlii Kue First Nation and comes from Icelandic Settler Canadian lineage, with roots in Saskatchewan. After a career in office administration and local politics, Kristen saw the need for more Indigenous leadership in social work and Indigenous healing. She returned to academia with to begin her education in social work. Once she received her diploma, she began working for her regional Indigenous Organization, Dehcho First Nations, where she is now the Regional Health & Wellness Director.

Her passion lies in creating culturally relevant programs and services for Indigenous communities. While building the Health & Wellness Division, Kristen completed her undergraduate degree in social work and is currently pursuing a Master of Social Work at the University of Victoria.



ACADEMIC REGALIA



















At live Convocation ceremonies, the academic regalia worn by the graduates and the members of the platform procession may consist of a gown, a hood or stole (worn over the shoulders), and a hat or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive academic dress for each degree conferred and, at times, for the disciplines in which the degree is awarded.









With the exception of students graduating with a PhD and federated college students, graduates wear black gowns. PhD graduates wear a black velvet gown with gold trim and a black velvet tam with gold tassel.

Students graduating from the University of Regina who have been registered through a federated college wear the following: red gowns for Campion College students, sky blue gowns for First Nations University of Canada students, and royal blue gowns for Luther College students. Students are welcome to wear their Indigenous ceremonial dress, other cultural ceremonial dress, or their military or law enforcement dress uniform with, or instead of, the gown at the Convocation ceremonies.

CEREMONIAL FURNITURE

The three ceremonial chairs were a gift to the University of Regina from Dr. Terence R. McKague, Chancellor Emeritus, who served as Chancellor from 1989-1995. The chairs were acquired from Carmichael United Church, Dr. McKague's boyhood place of worship. This ceremonial furniture is incorporated into all official ceremonial functions.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY

The University of Regina is situated on Treaty 4 lands with a presence in Treaty 6 territory. These are the territories of the nêhiyawak (Cree), Anihşinapek (Saulteaux), and Dakota, Lakota, and Nakoda, and the homeland of the Métis/Michif Nation. Today, these lands continue to be the shared territory of many diverse peoples from near and far.

The University of Regina operates under the terms of *The University of Regina Act*. Convocation comprises the Chancellor, the Senate, all graduates of the University of Regina, all graduates of the University of Saskatchewan at Regina Campus, and such other classes of persons as the Senate may from time to time determine. Convocation meets twice annually, in Spring and Fall, unless there are extraordinary circumstances.

The Chancellor is elected by the members of Senate, holds office for three years, presides over Convocation, confers degrees and is *ex officio* Chair of the Senate and a member of the Board of Governors.

Senate is the University's "window on the world." It is concerned with the academic welfare of the institution and has a variety of duties and powers. Most of the broader issues of academic policy within the University are reserved for Senate's approval. In another role, it acts as an ultimate court in academic affairs. The membership of Senate includes persons *ex officio*,

or by virtue of the University offices they hold. Convocation elects another fourteen members of Convocation to the Senate. Students registered in the University elect six students of the University to Senate. In addition, any professional society, group or organization in the province that Senate believes contributes in a significant way to the social, economic and cultural welfare of the province may be represented on Senate.

The Board of Governors consists of eleven members and is responsible for overseeing the administrative and business affairs of the University. It ultimately has authority in matters related to the raising and spending of University funds, and the acquisition and management of University property.

Council's membership includes administrative officers, all Deans and directors of academic programs, all full-time members of the teaching staff, and a number of student representatives. All matters of substance related to the academic affairs of the University, as well as matters of academic discipline, must be considered and approved by the Council.

The Executive of the University of Regina Council (Executive of Council) has been empowered by Council to act on its behalf. Executive of Council membership is devised as a proportional basis of the academic composition of the University.

Disciplines that are related to one another in the broader areas of teaching are, for purposes of administrative and academic planning, brought together into Faculties, of which there are currently ten. Each Faculty is headed by a Dean; formal membership includes the Dean and the teaching members of the various associated disciplines. The Deans are recognized by *The University of Regina Act* as being the heads of their respective Faculties and are directly responsible to the President through the Provost and Vice-President (Academic). Subject to the statutes of the Senate and the University of Regina Council, each Faculty has charge of all matters of scholarship in its disciplines and programs.
