DO YOU WANT TO WITHDRAW FROM A CLASS?

November 17th is the last day to withdraw from classes. If you are thinking about dropping a class, **always** see an academic advisor for schedule planning. What you are dropping may be a pre-req that is needed for upcoming semesters, so re-scheduling is important! Book an advising appointment <u>online</u>.

DO YOU NEED TO GET INTO A CLASS BUT IT'S FULL?

It is so important to get on the WAITLIST! When we know how many students are trying to get into an engineering class, we can make further arrangements if necessary.

Get on the waitlist for non-engineering classes, too! It's so important!

Waitlists are:

- First come-first serve
- For lectures only; not labs. If your lecture is linked with a lab you can only get waitlisted for the lecture.
- Only available for specific courses

If you have a HOLD that prevents registration, you cannot register for the class, even if you have been notified of a waitlist opening. You will need to resolve holds before you are able to register.

When a seat becomes available, an email is sent to the first student on the waitlist at their Preferred Email Address (usually your University of Regina email). To check or update your preferred email, log into UR Self-Service under "Personal Information." You are encouraged to check your email regularly. You have the option to setup email forwarding if needed. Avoid Hotmail accounts due to potential technical issues." – Registrar's Office website

WHMIS

New students, exchange students and re-admitted students must complete "Undergrad Mandatory WHMIS" on UR Courses. Complete this soon, if you haven't already done so, and download your certificate. Otherwise, there is a registration hold on your account and you will not be able to register for the next semester of classes. There is no need to email us, as we are automatically notified when you download your certificate. We will gladly remove the WHMIS hold within 1-2 days.

Capstone students are expected to renew WHMIS. All should already be enrolled on UR Courses, but please contact Engg.Safety@uregina.ca if this is missing from your account. (For ENIN 400, students are completing Chemical & Lab Safety training as part of the project start-ups. Students must complete the online portion of Chemical & Lab Safety prior to November 4, as the workshop component will be held that day during class time. Chemical & Lab Safety training includes WH-MIS, so there is no need to renew WHMIS separately. This is for ENIN 400 students only).
