PhD STUDENTS - ENGG 800

If you are a PhD student the candidacy exam has a new guideline. The ENGG 800 Candidacy Exam Guideline can be found in full here: <u>https://www.uregina.ca/engineering/graduate-students/Index.html#fact_5_1</u>

Timing: All doctoral students must undergo a Candidacy Exam within **24 months** of their program start date. Any approved leave of absence will be accommodated during the calculation of these 24 months.

Purpose of the Candidacy Exam: The Candidacy Exam will evaluate the student's knowledge of their thesis topic, their research plan, and the anticipated timeline for completion. Generally, it is not required for the students to be able to demonstrate the complete methodology or significant amount of results of the thesis work during this candidacy exam.

ENGG 900

Friendly reminder, if you are a MASc or PhD student you must take ENGG 900 as part of your program. If you have taken 6 credit hours of research or more you are eligible to take ENGG 900. It is recommend that you take it 50% of the way through your research. This is a 0 credit hour class so it must be taken with other credit hours. Do not leave this until the very end as you cannot graduate without it. This class is only offered in Fall and Winter terms (Spring Summer 2025 is an exception and this will not happen again), so please plan accordingly.

SAFETY MOMENT

As part of our ongoing efforts to strengthen lab safety, **all graduate students with access to research labs, grad student offices and/or the MEng lounge must renew**

their access by June 15. (That is, unless you just received access within the past couple of months. You can check your approval email for your individual expiry date.)

What is Required for Renewal?

To renew your access, you must complete the following steps:

- 1. Complete the new <u>UofR Health & Safety Orientation</u> on UR Courses. This is a **new requirement** and is valid for one year.
- 2. Make sure other required training is up to date (Engineering Safety Orientation, WHMIS, Chemical & Lab Safety, etc.)
- Submit your <u>Access Renewal Request</u> online. Ensure you upload ALL of your required orientation/training documents before you submit, or it will be rejected. Also check your room selections carefully. Students often make errors in this section, also resulting in rejection.
- For all research labs (except computer labs), complete a Lab-Specific Orientation WITH your supervisor, in your lab(s). Your supervisor will upload the completed orientation checklist as part of their online approval, which is a new requirement.

To avoid any disruption to your access, please begin the renewal process as soon as possible and coordinate with your supervisor to complete the required orientation.

At any time, you can revisit the <u>Access Renewal Request</u> online to check the status of your request. "Supervisor" means it is waiting for your supervisor to approve. "Office" means it is waiting for the Safety Coordinator (Lauren Bradshaw) to review and approve. You will receive an email from <u>Engg.Safety@uregina.ca</u> once the approval is final.

NOTE: If you recently submitted a request for access or renewal and are waiting for Office approval, please **DO NOT** resubmit. We are currently experiencing a very high volume of training and access requests, and they are being reviewed in the order received. We will follow up later to ensure your online and lab-specific orientations are complete.

Why Is the Lab-Specific Orientation Important?

The U of R's safety training and online orientations provide essential foundational knowledge, but every research lab has its own specific hazards and procedures. A **lab**-**specific orientation ensures you are prepared to work safely** in your unique research space. This is also a requirement under the U of R Safety Policy and

Saskatchewan OHS legislation, which state that students must be trained and informed about the hazards of their specific work environment. This also helps you and your supervisor to uphold the APEGS Code of Ethics, to "hold paramount the safety, health and welfare of the public and the protection of the environment and promote health and safety within the workplace".
