Why do we need Emergency Wardens?

The recruitment of emergency wardens is essential for ensuring the safety of our campus community before, during, and after an emergency. They are the first line of defense in an emergency by establishing communication between emergency services and coordinating efforts on campus. Emergency Wardens also support our campus community by:

Quick and efficient responses: *In the event of an emergency, seconds matter.*

Emergency Wardens help to reduce response times to ensure that students, faculty, staff, and visitors are aware of the emergency and to quickly provide and receive instruction(s) as they are made available.

Organization and Coordination: During an emergency, it is important to have clear and organized responses.

Emergency Wardens ensure everyone on campus follow the instructions that are provided and assist in the safe evacuation of all persons.

Prevent Panic: During an emergency, fear and panic can lead to confusion and misinformation

Trained and competent Emergency Wardens are able to impose calm and provide important information to others during an emergency. This prevents panic and misinformation, allowing coordinated responses to be carried out.

Emergencies can happen anytime and anywhere. Recruitment and training of UofR Emergency Wardens will have a significant impact when responding to an emergency thus maintaining a high level of resilience for our organization.
