Candidate Instructions

Campaigning Information and Regulations

As many graduate students are often off campus or are distributed amongst the University of Regina population, campaigning to our entire student body can be difficult using traditional approaches. The URGSA seeks to ensure that the student body is well informed about the nominated candidates seeking election. In addition, we seek to encourage informed participation of voters by providing candidate profiles directly to the entire graduate student body in addition to voting instructions.

Campaigning Period

Campaigning for the election will begin: **Tuesday, September 1, 2026, at 9:00 a.m.**

Campaigning for the election will end: **Monday, September 14, 2026, at 11:59 p.m.**

Candidate Profiles

The candidate profile for each candidate will be printed by the CRO. Profiles of no more than 250 words, typed and double-spaced, and one photo (JPEG, BMP, or TIFF format) of the nominee should be submitted with the nomination package for each candidate. Photos should provide an accurate likeness of the candidate and should be suitable for publication. Please attach the photo as a separate file and not within the body of the candidate profile.

Candidate profiles and photos should be submitted along with the nomination package. Candidates are responsible for proofreading their profiles/platforms, and submitted profiles will be printed as received by the CRO. Candidate profiles and photos that are submitted after the nomination deadline will NOT be accepted.

The CRO will display the candidate profiles on the URGSA bulletin board during the campaign period. The CRO will also prepare a candidate booklet based on these profiles. This booklet will be emailed to all registered graduate students via email and will be considered the official list of nominees, and may be displayed within the University.

Posters

Because of the restricted board space available to the URGSA, **no campaign or candidate posters**, other than those posted by the CRO, will be permitted on campus during the campaigning period.

Social Media

Candidates may use social media to campaign during the campaign period. **All campaigning (online or otherwise), however, must cease on and during the voting period.**

Other

- No stickers will be permitted;
- Candidates may not spend more than \$20 CDN total on campaigning materials;

- No painting or chalking on buildings and sidewalks; Messages on blackboards/whiteboards are permitted;
- Off-campus advertising is not permitted (besides social media, email, and word of mouth);
- The logos of the URGSA or the University of Regina must not be used by any candidate; and,
- No active campaign will be allowed on polling days.

Voting Information and Rules

Electronic voting will be conducted.

Electronic polling for the election will begin: **Tuesday, September 15, 2026, at 9:00 a.m.**

Electronic polling for the election will end: **Thursday, September 17, 2026, at 9:00 p.m.**

Electronic voting will be operated under the following rules:

- Only registered graduate students will be permitted to cast a ballot.
- Votes will be tabulated by the URGSA after the electronic polls close on September 16, 2026. Results will be advertised by September 21, 2026.
