Spaces: A Campus Designed for You

Spaces are where campus life happens. From classrooms, labs, and studios to common spaces and places to move and unwind, they're built for meeting people, sharing meals, staying active, and making ideas real. Every space is designed to support how you learn, live, and feel your best.

HANG OUT. RECHARGE. CONNECT. →

Comfortable communal spaces across campus give students room to relax and connect between classes. Spots like the newly renovated Ad Hum Pit (pictured) are made for catching up with friends or taking a break, while student society lounges offer casual places for students in the same faculties to collaborate and connect. The ta-tawâw Student Centre provides a welcoming space for students to gather, take part in Indigenous cultural practices such as smudging and ceremonies, or simply spend time together. Campion Commons is another favourite, whether you're meeting your study group or grabbing a coffee from Robin's.



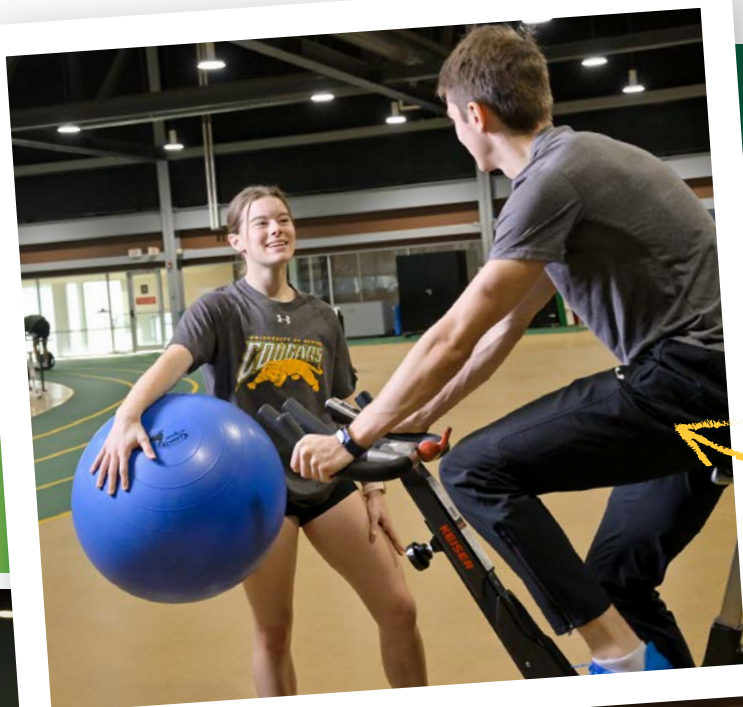
← SPACE TO REFLECT

Across campus, you'll find welcoming spaces where you can practice your faith and connect with your spiritual side. Campion College and Luther College have chapels for worship or quiet time, while First Nations University has an indoor tipi for pipe ceremonies and other cultural gatherings. U of R students also have access to a dedicated Muslim prayer room, as well as Wudu (ablution) spaces located in bathrooms across campus.

CLASSROOMS, STUDIOS, AND LABS

At U of R, you learn in spaces built to keep things hands-on and engaging. Classrooms use modern technology to make learning more interactive, while creative programs make use of studios where you can film, design, record, and build. Labs across campus let you get real experience in everything from AI, robotics, and data science to environmental testing, rock and soil analysis, health and movement research, renewable energy systems, and molecular biology. You won't just be learning about the future, you will be working in it!





GET MOVING

Staying active at U of R is easy, whether you're into sports, fitness, or just moving your body. The Centre for Kinesiology, Health and Sport is the hub, with a massive gym, fitness centre, indoor track, pool, and flexible spaces for classes like yoga and group workouts. Outdoor fields support soccer and football, and the campus connects directly to Wascana Park's trails for walking, running, or biking. From pick-up games to full workouts, there are plenty of places to move, compete, and feel good.

← HUNGRY? WE'VE GOT YOU COVERED.

Riddell Commons is the heart of campus life, a newly renovated and welcoming space where students come together to eat, relax, and hang out. With a wide mix of food vendors offering everything from Indian and Chinese cuisine to burgers, chicken, healthy options, coffee, and buffet-style meals, there is something for everyone. Students can also enjoy all-you-can-eat meals at the Luther College cafeteria, take part in trivia night at The Study Bar and Grill, or grab familiar favourites like Starbucks and Trifon's Pizza elsewhere on campus. Wherever you go, you will find great food and comfortable places to reset and refuel.

When it's time to concentrate, U of R has plenty of places to settle in. 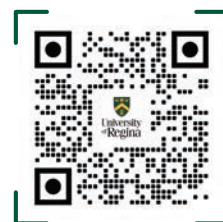

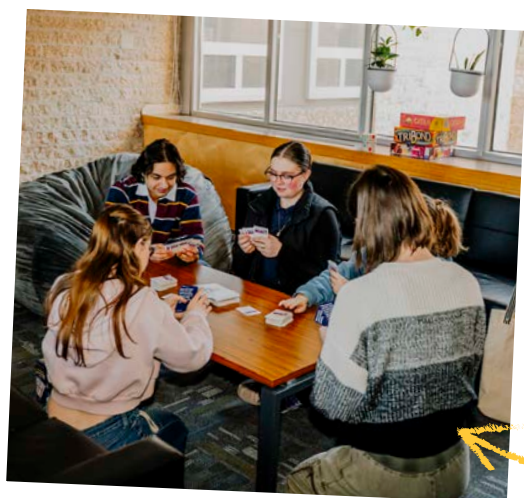

← CENTRE FOR EXPERIENTIAL AND SERVICE LEARNING

The Centre for Experiential and Service Learning (CESL) is designed to help you reach your goals by connecting you with intentional career exploration and related work experience. We provide students with valuable tools and opportunities to ensure that you graduate career-ready. All CESL services are offered on UR Path, a portal that is designed to help you track both in and outside classroom learning opportunities to help you build your resume and reflect on your experiences.



TA-TAWÂW STUDENT CENTRE →

The ta-tawâw Student Centre supports Indigenous students with their transition into university, including engagement in cultural, academic, community, and career supports. The Centre is home to the nitôncipâmin omâ Student Success Program for first-year Indigenous students and the Neekaneewak Leadership Initiative (NLI). The Neekaneewak Student Council promotes regular student activities and Indigenous student excellence is highlighted through the RBC Neekaneewak awards. The Centre is a gathering hub on campus, hosting major events, weekly student groups, and everything in between.



← STUDENT SUCCESS

The Student Success Centre at the U of R is your one-stop shop for academic supports! We offer:

- Learning skills consultations
- Academic excellence workshops
- Academic advising supports and services, including class registration assistance
- Free math, stats, and writing tutoring
- Tutor Registry for a variety of subjects
- Summer Bridge Program

The federated colleges also offer services designed to help you succeed. For example, Luther College helps ease the transition into first year through course bundles, where two or three classes are taken together with the same group of students. You'll make friends fast, have professors who know you, and get first access to popular Luther classes.

STUDENT ACCESSIBILITY

Student Accessibility exists to foster an inclusive learning environment where all students can fully participate and thrive. It offers:

- Academic accommodation and advocacy support for students with disabilities
- Assistance with government disability grant funding applications
- Recommendations for assistive technology
- Guidance on additional university and community supports to promote student success and resilience
- Access to the Brad Hornung Accommodations Test Centre, which provides an accessible, supportive exam environment tailored to students' accommodation needs.

← STUDENT HEALTH CLINIC

The Student Health Clinic is here to support both your physical and mental well-being while you're at university. You can see nurse practitioners for general medical care, sexual and transgender health, wellness support, and help connecting with specialists. If you're feeling overwhelmed or struggling, mental health professionals offer confidential, evidence-based counselling to help you build skills, resilience, and coping strategies. Care is flexible, inclusive, and focused on you as a whole person.



SPIRITUAL SUPPORT HUBS

Spiritual and cultural supports at the University of Regina are welcoming, inclusive, and available to all students. The University of Regina's Multi-faith Chaplaincy offers safe, supportive spaces for reflection, conversation, and spiritual well-being for students of all faiths and philosophies. First Nations University of Canada provides meaningful cultural and spiritual support through on-campus Elders, who offer traditional teachings, ceremonies, and personal guidance. Campion College supports students through its Campus Ministry, offering pastoral care and inclusive interfaith opportunities. At Luther College, students have the support of a Chaplain and an Elder who are there to walk with you throughout your university experience.

STUDENT ASSOCIATIONS →

Student associations at the University of Regina give students a voice and help build a strong sense of community on campus. The University of Regina Students' Association (URSA) represents students across the university, while students at Campion College, First Nations University of Canada, and Luther College are also supported by their own student associations. Together, these groups advocate for student needs, organize events and activities, support clubs and leadership opportunities, and help students feel connected, supported, and heard throughout their university experience.



Experiences: Learning That Takes Shape in the Real World

Experiences give you the chance to learn by doing. Through things like experiential learning, volunteering, and undergraduate research, you can apply what you're learning, work on real projects, and gain practical skills that prepare you for what comes next.



EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

As the first campus in Western Canada to offer a co-operative education program, where students alternate periods of study with periods of paid work, we're still the best. Co-op terms are anywhere from four to 16 months with various employers and work environments, and students earn \$9,000 to 15,000 per term.

We also offer plenty of other opportunities where you can learn by doing, including:

- Internships
- In-class experiential learning (simulations, labs, seminars, and case studies)
- Practicums
- Fieldwork
- Volunteering

At the University of Regina, our goal is to ensure all students participate in experiential learning!

VOLUNTEER CENTRE →

Our student-run Volunteer Centre will help you become a well-trained, well-rounded student volunteer that community partners can depend on. We believe in creating community-minded citizens - giving you the opportunity to live by our motto As One Who Serves. As an added bonus, volunteering can help you build transferable skills, and volunteer experience is essential to have on your resumé.



← CAMPION PRE-PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The Campion Pre-Professional Development Program prepares first-year students for competitive professional programs such as Medicine, Law, Dentistry, Pharmacy, and related fields. The program helps students understand what it truly takes to succeed beyond an undergraduate degree—from building strong academic and extracurricular foundations to preparing for required tests, applications, and interviews. Through guided sessions, students gain early insight into professional school expectations, learn how to position themselves as strong candidates, and make informed decisions about their academic and career pathways.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

At the University of Regina, undergraduate students don't just learn about research, they actively contribute to it. Thanks to the University's close-knit size and strong research focus, students have early and meaningful access to faculty-led projects across disciplines, often working alongside graduate students and community partners. Undergraduate researchers at U of R tackle real-world questions and cutting-edge challenges.

These opportunities are possible because faculty actively mentor undergraduates. Many U of R students begin research in their undergraduate degree and continue on to master's and PhD programs, both at the U of R and beyond. Whether your goal is professional school, graduate studies, or a research-informed career, undergraduate research at the University of Regina helps students build skills, confidence, and a competitive edge—early.

FOCUS ON STUDENTS

Daniel Wesey – Computer Science

Daniel Wesey, a second-year Computer Science student, is conducting interdisciplinary research at the intersection of artificial intelligence and neuroscience. He co-developed a psychophysical experiment measuring how the human brain encodes visual information and is testing how modern AI vision systems compare to human perception. His work has been presented at international workshops and is being showcased at the Vision Science Society annual conference.

Jordyn Gunderson – Chemistry

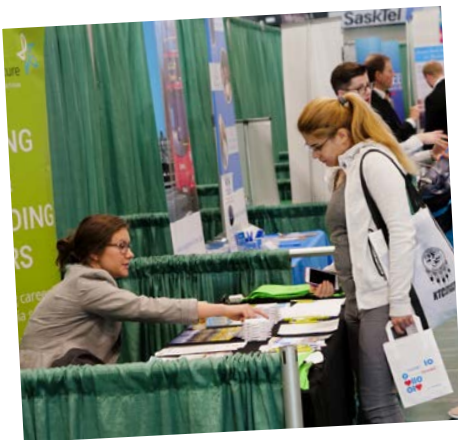
As an undergraduate chemistry researcher, Jordyn Gunderson worked on the synthesis of highly coloured Olympicene molecules for potential use in light-harvesting materials. She presented her research nationally at the Canadian Chemistry Conference and Exhibition, earning third place for best oral presentation and serving as a panelist on undergraduate research. Her work is currently being prepared for publication.

Kelsey Haczkewicz – Psychology

Kelsey Haczkewicz began conducting research during her undergraduate degree and is now a PhD student in Clinical Psychology. Her undergraduate work includes a published scoping review with over 50 citations and collaborative research with patient partners to shape intervention design and research priorities. Her path reflects how early research opportunities at U of R can evolve into advanced academic and professional training.

The Centre for Experiential and Service Learning (CESL) supports students in career skill development through:

- Career counselling
- Workshops on resumé writing, job searching, and interview preparation
- One-on-one resumé reviews
- Mock interviews
- Employer connections

In addition, CESL offers career fairs in the Fall and Winter terms. From first year to graduation, students have opportunities to meet employers who are actively hiring students and new graduates. Career fairs offer a welcoming environment to explore options, ask questions, and make meaningful connections that can lead to future employment.

As a U of R student, you can log in to UR Path to explore opportunities for career counselling, volunteering, and skill development, and earn recognition for the workshops and programs you participate in! FESTIVALS

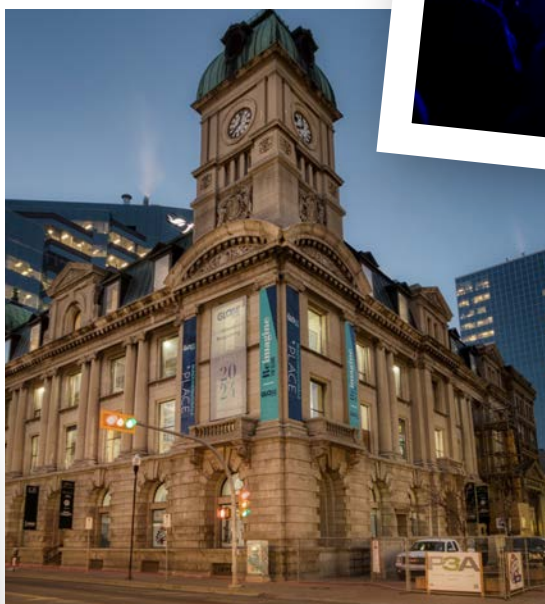
