

DREAMING OF BEING BILINGUAL?

The Certificate in French as a Second Language (CFLS) is a unique program designed to help you learn to read, write, and speak in French! Offered over two semesters, learning takes place in a small group where you will work closely with motivated and dynamic instructors.

In addition to learning the French language, you will learn more about Francophone culture with **field trips**, **guest presentations**, and **cultural activities**.

- Receive a \$500 bursary in each semester
- Complete a bilingual professional internship
- Get a free trip to Winnipeg for Le Festival du voyageur

- Complete a written and oral assessment
