FACULTY OF ARTS / **FACULTY OF SCIENCE**

CERTIFICATE IN FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY

Forensic psychology applies a body of psychological knowledge and research to the criminal justice system. This certification would be of interest to current students in the Humanities, Social Sciences, Social Work, Science, Kinesiology and Health Studies, Justice Studies, Police Studies, and Pre-Law students - really any discipline that touches on the legal system. The certificate is designed to be taken in conjunction with other U of R programs due to course prerequisites, not as a stand-alone program.

FACULTY OF ARTS CERTIFICATE IN OUEER. TRANS, AND GENDER STUDIES

This short, 6-course certificate combines all the courses offered across the Department of Gender, Religion, and Critical Thought that provide an area of study for students seeking 2SLGBTQI+ knowledge and training. This certificate is a great addition to any degree and for any individual who will work in service to the public! The certificate is designed to be taken in conjunction with other U of R programs due to course prerequisites, not as a stand-alone program.

FACULTY OF MEDIA, ART, AND **PERFORMANCE**

DIPLOMA IN CREATIVE TECHNOLOGIES

This two-year diploma program provides students with the ability think about technology and the arts in new ways, while working with and studying new media. This includes a variety of courses from the areas of fine arts, computer science, with additional theoretical material drawn from media and communications studies. This diploma can be a transition into the four-year Bachelor of Arts in Media, Arts, and Performance (Creative Technologies).

PAUL J. HILL SCHOOL OF BUSINESS BUSINESS QUALIFYING

PROGRAM

Students may be admitted into the Business Qualifying Program if they meet the high school admission average requirement (70%) and are missing no more than one of the high school course requirements.

Students who are admitted in the Business Qualifying Program must complete the missing high school course or approved post-secondary equivalent course within the first 30 credit hours of their program.

STUDENT AWARDS & FINANCIAL AID



We want to help students pay for school! Last year we awarded more than \$7.3 million in scholarships and bursaries to students. We have many automatic entrance awards as well as scholarships and bursaries that students can apply for using SAMS, our online student awards management system.

AUTOMATIC ENTRANCE AWARDS

We have five automatic entrance awards, which are calculated based on the student's early conditional admission average. Students applying directly from a Canadian high school or is a Canadian Citizen applying direct from a foreign high school would be eligible for the following automatic entrance awards:
