The Saskatchewan Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing (SCBScN) program is offered jointly by Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the University of Regina. As a SCBScN student, you will have the opportunity to access services and experience student life offered by both institutions.

As a student you will begin your nursing education in year one with opportunities to work directly with patients and clients.

When you graduate, you will receive a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) degree. You'll be ready to make a real difference in the lives of your clients and communities and work as valuable member of the health care team.



Applicants who have completed or are in the process of completing Grade 12\* or Adult 12 in Saskatchewan, must present the following courses for admission to the program:

English Language Arts A30\*\*
English Language Arts B30\*\*
One of Foundations of Math 30,
Pre-Calculus 30, or Calculus 30
Biology 30
Chemistry 30

A minimum grade of 70% is required in each of the above required courses.

Applicants with the highest admission average will be selected for the program.

Students applying outside of Saskatchewan or Canada need to present equivalent courses.

GED will not be accepted in lieu of Grade 12.

- \*Only students who are currently enrolled in high school will be considered for Early Conditional Admission. High school graduates will be assessed using the five (5) courses listed above.
- \*\*Applicants may substitute one of Français Franskaskois A30/B30 or Français Immersion 30 for English Language Arts A30 or B30. Applicants from Fransaskois and French Immersion programs may also substitute the equivalent subjects taught in French for those courses listed above.

# POST SECONDARY ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants who have attempted 15 or more credits hours of approved post-secondary education (by the application deadline) must meet the following criteria:

Successful completion of the required high school courses or a post-secondary equivalent. GED will not be accepted in lieu of Grade 12.

A minimum 65% Admission Grade Point Average (AGPA) on the last 30 credit hours of approved postsecondary courses presented.

Applicants with the highest Admission Grade Point Average (AGPA) will be selected for the program.

#### **INDIGENOUS STUDENTS**

The SCBScN program has 17% of new student admission seats designated for applicants of Indigenous Ancestry within Canada.

The SCBScN program also recognizes Indigenous people from the United States who belong to the Jay Treaty. Applicants within this category will be eligible for domestic tuition.

Applicants within these categories must fully meet admission requirements.

#### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The SCBScN program has 5 seats for international students in year 1 of the program.

## **BILINGUAL NURSING OPTION**

The SCBScN program offers the Bilingual Nursing Option to students who meet the French and English language proficiency requirements.

Students will complete a minimum of 40% of their program requirements in the French language.

# COURSES THAT CAN BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO ENTRY

Applicants interested in applying to the SCBScN Program can complete courses at the U of R prior to entry, these courses include:

- Statistics 100 (in French\*)
- English 100 (French 352\*)
- INHS 100 (INDG 100 in French\*)
- Three Open Electives (in French\*)
- One of the following Anatomy and Physiology combinations:
  - BIOL 110 and BIOL 111
  - o KIN 261 and KIN 262
  - KIN 260, KIN 267, and KIN 268
     BIOL 111, KIN 262, KIN 267,
     and KIN 268 must be
     completed with a minimum
     grade of 60%

Courses marked with a \* are bilingual option course replacements.

Post-Secondary courses ten years or older may not be granted credit towards the program.
