Health Certificate:

- Students may be required to provide a health certificate or medical documentation for their visa/immigration application. This is common with Japan, South Korea, Thailand.
- Please schedule an appointment with your primary care physician or the [UofR Student Health Clinic](#).

Immunizations:

- Some countries and schools may require proof of vaccination/s.
- Please consult your primary care physician and the [Government of Canada Travel Advisory](#) for more information on country-specific immunization requirements & recommendations.
- Vaccinations and TB testing can also be completed at the [Regina Travel Health Centre](#).

Travel Health Centre in Regina:

- A full range of [immunization](#) and assessment for risk of malaria and altitude illness, and provide prescriptions for recommended medications.
