John Archer was born in July 1914 in Broadview, Saskatchewan. He taught school from 1933 to 1940 and served with the Royal Canadian Artillery in World War II until 1945 when he was discharged having attained the rank of Captain and later, becoming an Honorary Colonel in 1973.

In 1947 Archer received a Bachelors degree in Arts and in 1948 a Masters degree in Arts from the University of Saskatchewan. A Bachelor of Library Science degree was attained from McGill University in 1949.

Archer was the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan Librarian from 1951 to 1964 and the assistant clerk of the Legislature from 1956 to 1961, the provincial archivist from 1957 to 1962 and chairman of the Committee on Continuing Education in Saskatchewan from 1962 to 1964 when he became the Director of Libraries at McGill University. From 1967 to 1970, Archer was an archivist and an Associate Professor of History Queen's University where from he earned a Doctor of Philosophy degree.

In 1970, he became Principal of the University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus and was appointed as the first president of the University of Regina in 1974 serving until 1976.

Archer has written much on the topic of Saskatchewan, its history, and its people, he was made a Officer of the Order of Canada in 1980 and in 1987 was awarded the Saskatchewan Order of Merit.

Archer passed away in 2004.

Scope and Content: This collection ranges in date from 1977 to 2001 and includes meeting programs and active members lists of Ye Knights of Ye Iron Crock. Sanguinary Armisticians group of which Archer was a member. This group meets at Regina's Hotel Saskatchewan on November 11 each year to pay tribute to those who have given their lives in battle for their country. They assemble to toast their honored dead and have breakfast together bedecked in the regalia of the order, an iron crock suspended by a red silk cord.
