Biographical Sketch:

In 1993 Natalie received a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Fine Arts degree majoring in Art History from the University of Regina. In her Honour's paper she wrote about the art work of ten Saskatchewan women of Ukrainian descent. She continued her university education and was awarded a Master of Arts (Canadian History) degree in 1998. Her Master's thesis explored the involvement of Savella Stechishin and the first Ukrainian-Canadian women's movement. In October 1998 Natalie presented a paper at a conference at the University of Toronto comparing Ukrainian Canadian women's experiences in Canada and the United States with emphasis on Savella Stechishin. A paper she wrote on Savella Stechishin and the Ukrainian-Canadian women movement was published by the Saskatchewan History journal in the current fall edition (1999). Natalie has authored two books: (2002) "75 Years of Service, Friendship and Commitment" Ukrainian women's Association of Canada, Regina and (2009) "Blossoming of a Ukrainian Canadian: Savella Stechishin". She has presented papers at various functions.

Natalie has been and continues to be very active as a volunteer in the community. In 1993 she received a Canada 125 Medal and the City of Regina Volunteer Vital Link and in 1990 and 2002 was awarded Citizen of the Week.

Scope and Content: This collection includes research from the donor's unpublished thesis and publication on Ukrainian women's activism. It consists of 58 centimeters of records. The date range of this material is from 1926 to 1998. There are a total of 168 photographs and 5 sheets of negatives

Custodial History: This collection was sent to Archives and Special Collections by the donor.

Legal Agreement: The legal agreement was signed in August 2007.
