Biographical Sketch:

Dr. Jim Daschuk is an historian with a background in anthropology, since attaining his post doctorate in History, from the University of Manitoba in 2002, Dr. James (Jim) Daschuk has focused his research on the intersection between environmental change and health and has been researching and teaching in the field of Aboriginal health for nearly twenty years. He teaches the Health Studies 200 course, "Understanding Health and Illness" for the Faculty of Kinesiology and Health Studies where his class explores the major theories and models of health and illness (biomedical, health promotion, population health). These course projects by the students in the class are a culmination of personal journals and news clippings during the 2009 influenza A H1N1 Pandemic.

Scope and Content: The records in this collection include personal journals and newspaper clippings. This collection consists of 26 centimetres of textual records, 1 photograph, 1 Compact Disk. The projects were all undertaken in 2009.

All plastic bindings were removed from the course projects, preservation copies were made of the newspaper clippings, the photograph was sleeved and the compact disk was printed out. Student numbers, where present, were omitted.

Custodial History: The collection was donated by the course instructor. The students were aware that their projects would be deposited in the Archives.

Legal Agreement: A donation agreement with Dr. Daschuk is dated 4 January 2010. Students participating in the project signed release forms agreeing to deposit their journals in the Archives.

Future Accruals: None are expected.

Access Restrictions: This collection is restricted until 31 December 2014. During that time access will be granted at the discretion of the University Archivist.
