Biographical Sketch: Fred W. Anderson was born in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan on April 20, 1920 to Edward and Leila (Woodley) Anderson. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree as well as a Master of Arts degree from the University of Saskatchewan and did post-graduate work at the London School of Economics. In 1951 he joined the University of Saskatchewan, Regina College as a special lecturer in Economics and Political Science. Anderson held many posts throughout his career including an appointment as Dean of Anthropology from 1972 to 1975. He was also co-ordinator of the Canadian Plains Study program beginning in 1977 until his retirement in 1983.

Scope and Content: This collection contains mainly magazine articles and clippings that were of interest to Mr. Anderson on such topics as economics, education, universities and colleges, and others (i.e., Nuclear Disarmament). The collection also includes studies in which he participated as well as files relating to various aspects of the University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus, including curriculum review in 1964 and 1969.
