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DAVID THAUBERGER

NOTE ON ARRANGEMENT: These files are in folders as they were found. They have been culled and then arranged according to subject and then alphabetically within the subject area.

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BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: David Thauberger had no particular intention to become an artist until he was studying at the University of Regina to become a teacher. His interest in art, ignited by a summer course, soon overtook his objective of becoming a teacher, although in his early years as a professional artist he supplemented his income by conducting workshops and teaching art classes. After two years in the United States (MA--California State University 1972, and MFA--University of Montana 1973) he returned to his native Saskatchewan and took up residence there. Since 1973 his importance as a Canadian artist has grown to the point that his works must often be borrowed back from collections all over North America in order to be exhibited. His work has been included in dozens of exhibitions (both group and solo) and he has been commissioned to create works for various corporations and individuals. He has also served as a juror in a number of art competitions.

The use of different styles, techniques, and media over the years has made it difficult to locate Thauberger in the artistic spectrum. He worked primarily with ceramics until 1975 when he switched to full-time painting, a discipline for which he had no formal training. As a painter he took most of his instruction from "folk artists", people he viewed as being "untutored artists" whose subconscious perceptions of place and tradition create truly authentic works of art, whatever their deficiencies as stylists or technicians. This experience makes him something of a hybrid--an educated folk artist.

His central preoccupation is a desire to "come to terms with place", places lived in and experienced rather than merely observed or experienced vicariously. He describes it as a "search for belonging, a coming to terms with [his] milieu and the place in which [he] works", whence comes, of course, his admiration for the folk artist. Community life, values, and concerns are the things he wishes to filter through his sensibilities as an artist.

Thauberger's constant experimentation over the years has caused the critics some consternation. His Sacramento experience and the influence of David Gilhooly account for the California "funk" element of his work, an element that is difficult at first to reconcile with his formal concerns of "flatness" and "frontality". For some his work is witty, humourous or irreverent, and involves "no smashing of traditions, but [a] purposeful and persistent breaking of the rules." For others his work is "about as beautiful as a dentist's drill hitting a nerve" and is "brash", "lurid", "extravagant", or "garish". He has been described as a "regionalist", a "high realist primitive", a "representationalist", and a creator of "kitsch" (a description he welcomes to some degree). Inability to pigeonhole his work has prompted at least one critic to ask "Will the real David Thauberger please stand up?". For his part, Thauberger says that his emphasis is on statement more than technique and that celebration (through art) of the things we know and love does not exclude us from critique (through art) of those same things. It would seem that it remains to be determined whether his work is "affectionate" commentary, or an ironic, moody rebellion against the art establishment. It is certain only that his work will continue to be interesting and controversial.
