In 1951 he joined the University of Saskatchewan, Regina College as a special lecturer in Economics and Political Science. Anderson held many posts throughout his career including an appointment as Dean of Anthropology from 1972 to 1975. He was also co-ordinator of the Canadian Plains Study program beginning in 1977 until his retirement in 1983.
