Arrangement: The records were collected and created by Dr. Lloyd Barber while he was the Indian Claims Commissioner. The original order was maintained where possible, otherwise order was imposed alphabetically

Restrictions: Restrictions apply to the Kootenay Plains and the Bighorn/Wesley Stony Band files.
Permission to see these files may be obtained in writing from the Stoney Tribal Administration, Morley, Alberta.

Scope and Content: The Indian Claims Commissioner fonds consists of three series and ten sub-series. The series titles are: Indian Claims Commission, University of Saskatchewan and sound Recordings. The sub-series titles are: Conferences, correspondence, Daily Journal, Document Files, General, Land Claims court cases, Publications, Organizations, Speeches, Treaties.

Biographical Sketch:

Name: Lloyd Ingram Barber. His Parents were Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Muir Barber. His wife is Muriel Pauline, most often referred to as Duna. They had six children: Muir, Brian, Kathleen, David, Susan, and Patricia.

Place of Residence: Lloyd Barber was born in Regina, Saskatchewan on March 8, 1932. He grew up and received his primary and part of his secondary education in Regina Beach, Saskatchewan. He completed his secondary education at the Luther College in Regina. In 1950, he moved to Saskatoon to begin his University career at the University of Saskatchewan. Except when completing his M. B.A. and Ph.D, he remained in Saskatoon until 1976. He then moved to Regina to fulfill his obligation as the University of Regina President. In 1990, he retired from the University of Regina and moved permanently to Regina Beach.

Occupation, life, and activities: Lloyd Barber received a Bachelor of Arts in Economics in 1953 and a Bachelor of Commerce in Administration in 1954 at the University of Saskatchewan. He received a Masters Degree in Business Administration (marketing) from the University of California in 1955 and a Doctor of Philosophy in 1964 from the University of Washington. He joined the University of Saskatchewan as an Instructor in 1955.

Later he became Dean of Commerce at the University in 1966. From 1968 to 1974, he served as the University Vice-President. He then resigned his position as Vice-President from the University of Saskatchewan and took a two year leave of absence from the University until his appointment as President for the University of Regina on January 1, 1976. He served as President until his retirement in 1990.

Outside the academic sphere, Lloyd Barber perhaps is most noted for his appointment by the Privy Council of Canada as Canada's Indian Claims Commissioner. He held this appointment from 1969 until 1977. He also helped to establish the Saskatchewan Indian Federated College which he remains as their Chief Negotiator.

He has held numerous appointments to Boards and Directorships such as Board of Directors for the Bank of Nova Scotia, Husky Oil of Canada, and Canadian Pacific. Lloyd Barber is a companion of the order of Canada and has received the Aboriginal Order of Canada. His other awards include the Centennial medal, the Vanier medal, honorary professor at Shandong University in China, and honorary degrees at the Universities of Alberta and Concordia.

Notes: Other Accessions in the Lloyd Barber Fonds are: 90-29 and 95-10.

Custodial history: The records comprising the Lloyd Barber Fonds were held by Lloyd Barber before being transferred to the University Archives.
