**Biographical Sketch:**

Fred W. Anderson joined the University of Saskatchewan, Regina College in 1951. He remained a member of the Economics Department until 1983. He was appointed chairman of the department in 1965. Born in Moose Jaw, he received his BA and MA degrees from the University of Saskatchewan and did post-graduate work at the London School of Economics. In 1951 – 1961, he was the Secretary and Research Director to the (Canadian) Royal Commission on Transportation. From 1973 – 1975, he was on leave from the University to organize and launch the Western Transportation Advisory Council. From 1977 – 78, he was Chairman of the Prairie Rail Action Committee, which was created to consider rail lines left undecided in the Hall Commission.
