Suggested ideas for creating an abstract

Suggested content in the section

Title	
Research problem or issue	What is your topic Why is your study needed? What is the problem you will examine? What is the gap in knowledge? Why is your study clinically important and/or policy relevant? What are the contextual features surrounding the topic?
Objectives	Aim = what are you hoping to achieve? Objective = what actions are you taking to meet this aim?
Methods, data collection, and analytic approach	What type of research are you doing? (qualitative, quantitative, mixed method, etc.) How will you collect data? (Interview, survey, systematic review) What analytic methods will be used? (SPSS, NVIVO, mapping etc.)
Results and findings (if applicable)	What are some key findings from your study?
Significance and importance Implications for practice, community or policy	How does your study impact clinical practice, theory or policy? What is significant about your study?

* Since students are at different stages of their doctoral journey, these guidelines are general and not all will apply.

How to Submit

In a word document, please submit the following information: Title of abstract, your name, your academic institution affiliation (e.g. PhD student at the University of Regina), stage in your doctoral program (e.g. Student, doctoral candidate, active in data collection, defense date imminent, etc.), and 250 word (maximum) abstract. All abstracts must be submitted by deadline posted on website. Please submit to: nursing.research@uregina.ca.

Presentations

All presentations are virtually delivered, with a maximum of 15 minutes to present and 5 minutes for questions. As we have a tight schedule to follow, presentations will be cut off at the 20 minute mark and then no feedback or questions will be allowed. You may use PowerPoint to assist in you presentation. As internet can be unreliable, you have the option of recording your presentation in advance and submitting. The days of the conference, you will be expected to present live but if you do have technical issues plan B will be to play your recording. Please
