## CUSC 2023 - 2020 Middle-Years Student Survey

## **CUSC Background**

The 2023 *Middle-Years Student Survey* marks the 29th cooperative study undertaken by the *Canadian University Survey Consortium / Consortium canadien de recherche sur les étudiants universitaires* (CUSC/CCREU) and the 24<sup>th</sup> study in which the University of Regina has participated.

The survey was distributed from January to April 2023 to close to 54,000 students at 29 universities across Canada. In total, 11,585 (21.5%) middle-years university students completed the survey. At the University of Regina, the survey was sent to 3,000 students (including those in the Federated Colleges). Middle-years students are those who have earned between 25 and 101 credits. A total of 982 (32.7%) students completed the survey.

## **Recommend university to others**

Students were asked to rate if they would recommend their university on a scale from 0 (not at all likely) to 10 (extremely likely). Using the Net Promoter Score calculation, where detractors (rating of 0 to 6) are subtracted from promoters (rating of 9 or 10), participating universities across Canada have a score of -13 (22% promoters minus 35% detractors). The University of Regina has a score of -26 (20% promoters minus 46% detractors).
