

Active Researchers are automatically added to our online booking system and will receive an email with further instructions. Bookings must be made by **4:30PM**







NEW DATASETS IN THE RDC

BUSINESS ECONOMIC ANALYSIS MICRODATA New!

The **Business Economic Analysis Microdata (BEAM)** is a set of linkable microdata files extracted from Statistic Canada's tax and administrative data. The BEAM contains information on all individual tax filers and all paid employees who were issued a T4 slip. All corporations that filed a T2 corporation tax return and all unincorporated businesses with a valid Business Number are also included in he BEAM. CANADIAN CANCER REGISTRY - INTERNATIONAL AGENCY FOR RESEARCH ON CANCER (CCR-IARC)

The **Canadian Cancer Registry** (<u>CCR</u>) is a population based registry that includes data collected and reported to Statistics Canada by each provincial/territorial cancer registry. The person based CCR collects information about each new primary cancer diagnosed among Canadian residents since 1992.

CANADIAN CANCER REGISTRY - SURVEILLANCE EPIDEMIOLOGY AND END RESULTS (CCR-SEER)

The **Canadian Cancer Registry** (<u>CCR</u>) is a population based registry that includes data collected and reported to Statistics Canada by each provincial/territorial cancer registry. The person based CCR collects information about each new primary cancer diagnosed among Canadian residents since 1992.

CANADIAN SOCIAL SURVEY - QUALITY OF LIFE AND COST OF LIVING (CSS-W3)

The purpose of the **Canadian Social Survey - Quality of Life and Cost of Living** (<u>CSS-W3</u>) is to collect information about the quality of life and cost of living in Canada. Results from the survey will provide important information about well-being, life opportunities and the impacts of inflation on individuals and families. This information will help decision makers develop programs and policies to better serve all Canadians.

LONGITUDINAL AND INTERNATIONAL STUDY OF ADULTS (LISA)

The **Longitudinal and International Study of Adults (LISA)** collects information from people across Canada about their jobs, education, health and family. The study is interested in how changes in these areas affect people's lives. This study aims to help improve education, employment, training and social services in Canada.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING (MAID)

The **Medical Assistance in Dying** (MAID) is based on reports from physicians and nurse practitioners on written requests for and provisions of MAID across Canada for the 2019, 2020 and 2021 calendar years.

PILOT STUDY ON EVERYDAY WELL-BEING (PSEW) New!

The **Pilot Study on Everyday Well-being (<u>PSEW</u>)** asks Canadians in-the-moment questions about their activities and feelings. The goal is to gain a better understanding of the factors that influence well-being, particularly arts and culture activities, which are the main focus of this pilot.

VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS FILE New!

The Vehicle Registrations File (VR) are extracted from administrative files supplied by provincial and territorial governments. They are received as snapshots, taken at the end of each quarter. The data comprises records of all active registered vehicles in the province, with inactive vehicles excluded. Only records with an expiry date falling after the snapshot end date (i.e., end of the reference quarter) are included. The data consists of two sets of variables, namely provincial variables and VIN decoder variables.
