

## Application Process

The application deadline is November 1st each year. Application is available online at <https://www.uregina.ca/admissions/graduate/index.html>. The application fee is \$125 CAD for all domestic and international applicants (subject to change).



You will need the following documents for your application:

- A completed online application form
- Official transcripts
- Applicants with international BSW credentials who apply for admission to the MSW Program are required to provide the WES International Credential Advantage Package (ICAP) Course-by-Course report for degree equivalency and GPA calculation as per Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research (FGSR).
- Two Letters of Recommendation
- A Resume and a Letter of Intent
- English Proficiency test scores (if applicable)

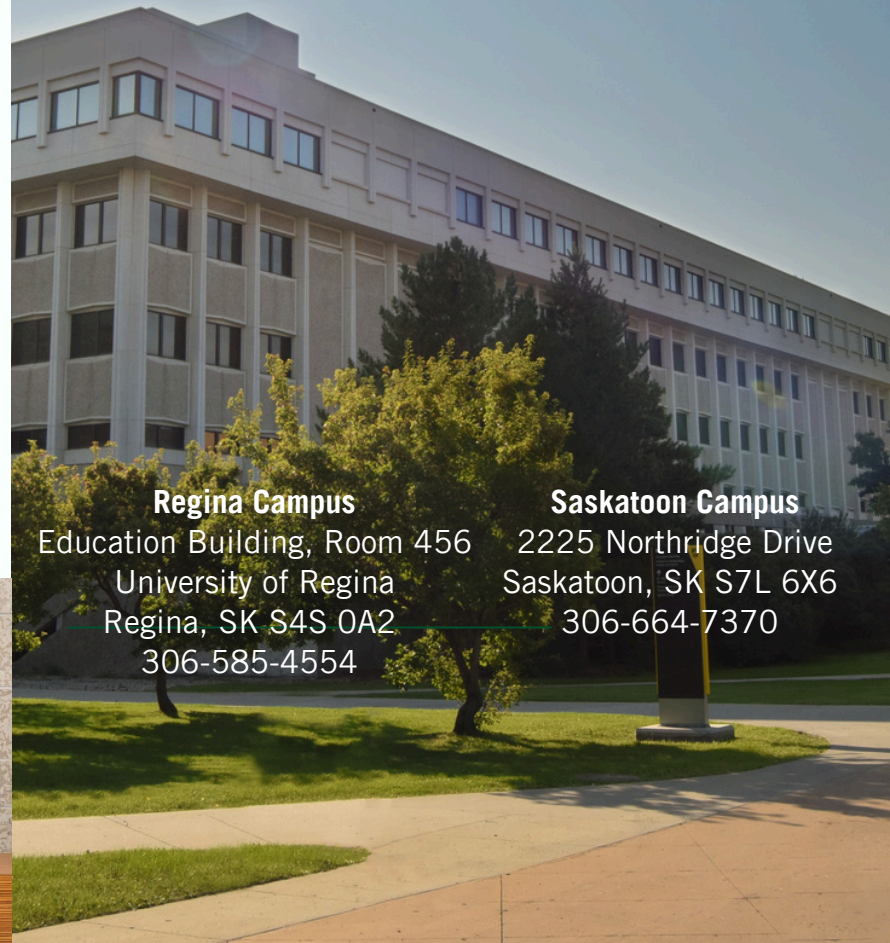

# Program Overview

The Master of Social Work (MSW) degree from the University of Regina is accredited by the Canadian Association for Social Work Education (CASWE-ACFTS). It is the only accredited MSW program in Saskatchewan.

The MSW program prepares students for advanced generalist social work practice, including management, policy formulation, program consultation, research, and direct social work within human services. The program emphasizes critical analysis of knowledge, theory, and practice to understand the interrelation of social research, social work practice, policy development, administration, and community development to support individuals, families and communities.

# Admission Requirements

- Attainment of a BSW degree
- A qualifying graduating average of 70%
- At least two years demonstrated professional experience in the human service field
- Two written references, preferably one professional reference and one academic reference



# Program Delivery Method

Our MSW courses are thoughtfully designed with the latest pedagogical and technological advances to offer flexibility and choice. We use hybrid and blended methods of instruction that allow students to participate either on-campus or virtually to accommodate their busy professional schedules. Students have the opportunity to engage with course material in their own time asynchronously, as well as participate in live sessions synchronously via platforms like Zoom. Active engagement with the course material and collaboration in experiential learning are all aimed at enhancing students' graduate program experience.

## FLEXIBLE OPTIONS TO FIT YOUR LIFESTYLE!

All students admitted to the MSW program must have access to computer and high speed internet for the duration of their program of studies in order to participate in courses delivered by web based learning, and for program administration purposes. Students are also expected to participate in an online orientation prior to program commencement, and attend online seminars held each semester.

# Program Options and Requirement

The MSW is a 30-credit-hour program that offers the option to complete the degree with either a thesis or a field education. Candidates may be enrolled on either a full time or part time basis. Students have a maximum of five years to complete the thesis program and six years to complete the field education program. Below are the degree requirements:
