



Admission Requirements

Applicants must hold a 3- or 4-year Social Science degree from an approved/accredited Canadian post-secondary institution with a graduating GPA of 70%.

Applicants who meet the minimum academic requirements will have their application evaluated by a social work review panel. Reviewers will assess applicants' critical thought, self-awareness, ethics, and values.

How do I apply?

Applications into the BSW After Degree must be received through online submission by January 15th of any given year.

About Our Program

The Bachelor of Social Work After Degree provides an accelerated pathway for students who already hold a related undergraduate degree to complete the BSW in two years.

The Bachelor of Social Work After Degree consists of 60 credit hours, including 39 credit hours of Social Work courses and two practicums.

Program Locations

The Faculty of Social Work offers the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) province wide and has campuses in **Regina** and **Saskatoon**. Students may also complete most of the program from a distance.

Courses are offered in-person, online, and remotely via Zoom.

Practicum Information

Practicum involves 700 hours of direct practice in human service agencies and other settings in which students are exposed to situations that call for their active engagement in a helping role.

Students may be placed in government or community-based agencies, in locations throughout Saskatchewan and Canada, and across a variety of fields including health care, social services, education, and corrections.

What If I Have Courses From Another Institution?

Any previously completed courses that transfer as SW courses must fit into the BSW After Degree program requirements (a maximum of 15 transfer credit hours is permitted).

The Faculty of Social Work may grant transfer credit for SW 348 if a previous practicum experience, from another educational institution, is evaluated to be equivalent.
