Master of Social Work

The MSW from the University of Regina is accredited by the Canadian Association for Social Work Education (CASWE)

Integrative analysis is emphasized as a means of understanding the interrelatedness of social research, direct practice, policy development, and social administration

Program Description

Students will develop advanced social work techniques, gain a deeper knowledge of modes of social intervention, recognize and integrate values integral to human service professionals, and become aware of broader aspects and issues of service delivery, social policy analysis, and social welfare research

Classes are offered face-to-face in both Regina and Saskatoon, and at times through video conference

The program offers flexibility for students with full time and part time enrollment options available



University of Regina

MSW classes are offered through the University of Regina at either the Regina campus, housed in the Education Building at the University of Regina, or the Saskatoon Campus, housed at Innovation Place. Campuses are located on Treaty 4 and 6 Land

The University of Regina is home to 10 faculties and 25 departments which have established reputations for excellence and innovative programs

In Fall of 2014, nearly 14,000 full and part time students were enrolled at the University, along with the three federated colleges, Campion College, First Nations University of Canada, and Luther College

- ◆ Bachelor of Social Work
- ◆ 70% qualifying average
- ◆ Two references
- ◆ Minimum two years employment in social work practice, or in a comparable human service discipline

Completion Options

Diverse course offerings include research methods (qualitative & quantitative), social policy, direct practice, Indigenous perspectives, and social justice

Students are encouraged to advance their professional knowledge base, particularly in the areas of social policy and social justice. By undertaking a thesis or practicum, students may increase their research or direct social work practice skills through engagement with individuals, families, groups, communities, or organizations.

Program Completion Options

(30 credit hrs)

Thesis - six courses, including two research courses, a Thesis Proposal course, two electives, and thesis

Field Practicum - six courses, including two research courses, four electives, a field practicum, and field practicum report

Research Practicum - six courses, including two research courses, four electives, a research practicum, and research practicum report
