- Uncertainty with respect to who will administer the training and how this will be verified
- Lack of clarity in the proposed policy regarding President's Committee on Animal Care (PCAC) responsibility in situations where there has not been previous peer review
- Roles and responsibilities of the animal facilities manager are not defined
- Responsibilities of those who do research or teaching using animals is not differentiated for faculty members and students – should there be increased responsibilities for faculty members/principal investigators?
