# **DECLARATION OF ELIGIBILITY**

### TO WORK ON CAMPUS

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION, POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

According to the IRPR, full-time post-secondary students may work without a work permit on the campus of the university or college at which they are a full-time student R186(f). This authorization is valid for the period for which they hold a study permit at the institution and during which they are enrolled in full-time studies.

### **Work On Campus:**

You may work on campus if:

- you are a full-time student at the University of Regina
- · you have a valid study permit
- you have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)

You must stop working on-campus on the day you no longer meet the above eligibility requirements (e.g., if you are no longer a full-time student).

#### **Social Insurance Number:**

To work in Canada or access government programs and benefits, you need a 9-digit number known as a <u>Social Insurance Number (SIN)</u>. Your SIN is private and it is illegal for anyone else to use it. You are responsible for <u>protecting your SIN</u>.

To apply for a SIN to work on campus, you must have one (1) of these conditions printed on your study permit:

- May accept employment on or off campus if meeting eligibility criteria as per R186(f), (v) or (w). Must cease working if no longer meeting these criteria.
- This permit does not authorize the holder to engage in off campus employment in Canada. May accept employment only on campus if meeting eligibility criteria as per R186(f). Must cease working if no longer meeting these criteria.

If your study permit does not have one of the above conditions or remarks, you must submit a <u>request for an amendment to your study permit</u> before you can apply for a SIN. There is no fee for this request.

#### **Non-Compliance:**

Non-compliance with study permit conditions may result in enforcement action; that is, an <u>exclusion order</u> can be issued for non-compliance, per <u>subparagraph R228(1)(c)(v)</u>.

Non-compliance with study permit conditions or engaging in unauthorized work or study may also negatively affect future applications that are made under the IRPA and IRPR. For example, a subsequent study permit or work permit may not be issued until a period of 6 months has passed, since the cessation of the unauthorized work or study or failure to comply with a condition, per section R221 and subsection R200(3).

#### Registration Requirements for International Students at the University of Regina:

**International undergraduate students** must be registered full-time in each of the fall and winter terms. During the spring and summer term, international undergraduate students may register as a full-time or part-time student or take a break.

Full-time registration for international undergraduate students is defined as registered in a minimum of nine (9) credit hours during each of the fall and winter terms, as per the <u>Undergraduate Calendar</u>.

International graduate students should refer to the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research website for registration requirements.

**International English as a Second Language (ESL) students** should refer to the ESL section within the <u>Centre for Continuing Education</u> portion of the Undergraduate Calendar for registration requirements.
